







## Get to know your H<sub>2</sub>O

When you turn on the tap, do you know where the water comes from?

The Township of Langley's drinking water supply is from combined sources; Metro Vancouver's Coquitlam Watershed reservoir, and groundwater sources from underground aquifers within the Township. Having a mixed water supply keeps water utility rates reasonable and allows our local underground aquifers to recharge. With the Township's growing population and high demand for crop irrigation, maintaining a local supply of water is important for economic reliability and security.

The diagram on the front of this colouring sheet reflects how the Township of Langley's drinking water supply operates. The 'GVRD water source' refers to Metro Vancouver's Coquitlam Watershed reservoir. Drinking water from the reservoir is treated and then transported through a system of underground pipes to the Township. The 'groundwater aquifer' represents several underground aquifers throughout the Township!

## **Concept words**

Precipitation any product of the condensation of atmospheric water

vapour that falls under gravity. The main forms of precipitation include drizzle, rain, sleet, snow, and hail.

Water treatment plant a facility where processes make water suitable for drinking.

Aquifer an underground layer of water-bearing permeable rock or

unconsolidated materials (gravel, sand, or silt) from which

groundwater can be extracted using a water well.

Reservoir storage area where water is collected and kept in quantity

so that it may be drawn off for use.

Water main a principal pipe in a system of pipes for conveying water,

especially one installed underground.

Water well an excavation or structure created in the ground by

digging, driving, boring, or drilling to access groundwater

in underground aquifers.
